



PROMENADE SHAWL Designed for Feza Yarns

Dimensions: 29" x 81" at widest points

Yarn: 1 4 Shades Gradient Kit **Needles:** US #6/4mm 24"/61cm circ.

Gauge: 20 sts x 24 rows = 4''/10cm square in

stockinette stitch

Pattern Notes:

To create the vertical striping as presented, switch yarn colors every eight rows as you proceed through the pattern. See Color table below. Do not carry more than one color at a time along the edge.

Color Table:

The colors used to create this version of the pattern were knit in the following order, eight rows of each was used except for the first 16 rows which were knit with the first color. The colors; 1, 2, 3, and 4 vary from lightest to darkest. The entire skein of each is not used in this pattern and utilization of each color varies based upon placement in the shawl. Read colors from left to right in table below for color order:

After last color change, use color 4 once then work color schedule a second time in reverse

The border is crocheted using color 4.

As stitches are added on the RS of the work to the right edge of the shawl the pattern will progress to increase the number of columns of stitches until the widest point of the shawl is reached. At this point, on the RS of the work, the Kfb will be replaced by a SSK so as to maintain the symetry of the shawl as the rows are worked until 5 sts rem.

Ends are worked in under the crocheted edge that is applied after the knitting is completed.



Abbreviations:

BO -Bind Off

Ch - Chain stitch

CO - Cast On

EOR - End of Row

K - Knit

Kf&b - Knit into the front and back of the same stitch

P - Purl

Sc - Single Crochet

SSK - Slip Slip Knit

Sts - Stitches

Sl - Slip

Wyif - With Yarn in Front

Yo - Yarn Over

Pattern:

CO 5 using color 4

Row 1: Kfb, k4 (6 sts)

Row 2, and all even rows: Sllwyif, p to end of row

Row 3: Kfb, knit to EOR (inc 1 st) 3 5 7 9

Rows 5 - 10: Rep rows 3 -4 (10 sts)

Row 11: Kfb, yo, ssk, k7 (1 st inc, 11 sts)

Row 13: kfb, k2, yo, ssk, k6 (12 sts)

Row 15: kfb, k4, yo, ssk, k5 (13 sts)

Row 17: Kfb, k6, yo, ssk, k4 (14 sts)

Row 19: Kfb, k8, yo, ssk, k3 (15 sts)

Row 21: Kfb, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k2 (16 sts)

Row 23: Kfb, k2, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k1 (17 sts)

Row 25: Kfb, k4, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk (18 sts)

Row 27: Kfb, k6, yo, ssk, k9 (19 sts)

Row 29: Kfb, k8, yo, ssk, k8 (20 sts)

Row 31: Kfb, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k7 (21 sts)

Row 33: Kfb, k2, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k6 (22 sts)

Row 35: Kfb, k4, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k5 (23 sts)

Row 37: Kfb, k6, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k4 (24 sts)

Row 39: Kfb, k8, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k3 (25 sts)

Row 41: Kfb, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k2 (26 sts)

Row 43: Kfb, k2, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k1 (27 sts)

Row 45: Kfb, k4, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk (28 sts)

Row 47: Kfb, k6, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k9 (29 sts)

Row 49: Kfb, k8, yo, ssk, k8, yo, ssk, k8 (30 sts)

Row 51: Kfb, *yo, ssk, k8* to 9 sts from EOR, yo, ssk, k7 (inc 1 st)

Row 53: Kfb, k2, *yo, ssk, k8* to 8 sts from EOR, yo, ssk, k6 (inc 1 st)

Row 55: Kfb, k4, *yo, ssk, k8* to 7 sts from EOR, yo, ssk, k5 (inc 1 st)

Row 57: Kfb, k6, *vo, ssk, k8* to 6 sts from EOR, vo, ssk, k4 (inc 1 st)

Row 59: Kfb, k8, *yo, ssk, k8* to 5 sts from EOR, yo, ssk, k3 (inc 1 st)





Row 61: Kfb, *yo, ssk, k8* to 4 sts from EOR, yo, ssk, k2 (inc 1 st)

Row 63: Kfb, k2 *yo, ssk, k8* to 3 sts from EOR, yo, ssk, k1 (inc 1 st)

Row 65: Kfb, k4 *yo, ssk, k8* to 2 sts from EOR, yo, ssk (inc 1 st)

Row 67: Kfb, k6 *yo, ssk, k8* to 1 st from EOR, k1 (inc 1 st)

Rep rows 49-68 until 13 complete columns present themselves ending after completing row 68.

Work the rows backwards from 68 - 49 reverse shaping (ssk rather than kfb at beginning of each odd numbered row) maintaining the pattern of the yo, ssk k8 repeat until 5 sts rem.

BO all sts, do not cut yarn.

Edging:

Beginning at last st BO, pull up loop and cont as foll using US G crochet hook:

*sc, ch 2, sc into same st. ch 2, skip 2 selvedge knit stitches, rep from * around entire shawl tucking in ends as you come to them. There will be approximately two shells per inch as the edging is crocheted into the selvedge edge of the shawl.

Finishing:

Wash per ball band instructions. Block wet and allow to air dry. Enjoy your new shawl.
